

## LE TORCHET ROCK CLIMBING SCHOOL WALL

#### CHAMPAGNY VIII AGE

#### LE TORCHET

Schist slabs not very steep, from 15 to 25m. Wide flat and shady spot at the bottom (avoid the plateau at the top as it is a private property).

As all altitude sites, the boulder is subject to extreme frost-thaw cycles. It is made particularly sensitive to this by its leaf structure.

If you see that a flake is moving or that there is an irregularity on the gear in place, inform the mountain guides office or the tourist office.

The attendance being high during the summer, we advise you to avoid the 3pm-5pm time slot, used by the mountain guides.

#### ACCESS:

Bellow "Les Rochers" hamlet. Parking alongside the road, upstream from the area.

Don't park in front of the barrier as the access needs to be free for any potential emergency vehicle.

#### EQUIPMENT:

24 boulted routes. Anchor with quick links and chains (settle your top ropes with the quick link and not around the chains).

#### Colours of the plaques indicate the grade of the route.

Routes whose name is followed by (+) are overprotected (cluster of pegs).

Routes whose name is followed by (-) are dangerous (distant pegs).


Putting the top rope in from the top of the crag is not recommended, the grass slope being steep and not safe.

An anchor is set up on the big ledge between "Sanguine" and "Extravagance du parfait". It can, for instance, favour the learning of abseil.

In case of exiting by the top, go down by the ends (be careful the path can be slippery and wet)

### GRANDE ROCHE CLIMBING CRAG

#### **CHAMPAGNY-LE-HAUT**

#### **GRANDE ROCHE**

At the beginning of Champagny-le-Haut vale, this crag is facing the Grande Motte glacier, subject to the winter harshness: frost, thaw, avalanches... Thus you need to be careful at the start of the season. Be advised that the site is below a via-ferrata.

Between 10 and 25 routes, from 4a to 7a, divided between 2 cliffs.

- The Biga area, on the left: 150m

First area to be bolted, on the left when you arrive at the bottom of the cliff

- The Small area, on the right: 25m

Bolted in 2004 and 2005. The 3 routes styles are varied (one camber), on the right at the bottom of the cliff.

Equipment: athletic Boulder: schist

Profile : slab and vertical Type of holds: pockets, crimps Openers: D. Souvy, D. Tatoud, D. Mouchené, E. Allanos, JY Roche, A. Charrière.

#### ACCESS:

Towards Champagny-le-Haut for 3km. Park near the dam.

Cross the road and walk towards the path leading to "Via Ferrata depart  $n^{\circ}$  1". Turn left for the main sector and right for the small sector — 15min

#### **EQUIPMENT:**

Biners for top rope


70m ropes; 100m rappel for the routes of several lengths.

14 draws at the most.

#### **DESCENTS:**

- Aster au vide: with a 70m rope, a 33m rappel from R3 to the summit of "Miss Air", (don't stop at R2), then a 35m abseil.
- Lévitation: with a 70m rope, a 20m rappel in the big roof, from R2 to R1 of "Aster au vide" then a 30m abseil.
- Cerf volant: with a 100m rope, 3 abseils





## LA RAVIÈRE CLIMBING CLIFE



#### LA RAVIERE:

The small crag of La Ravière is located next to the hamlet of the same name, at the altitude of 1640m, above Champagny-en-Vanoise.

Facing South-East, it moves to the shadow around 1 pm-2 pm in Summer, which is perfect for hot days.

The rock is an homogeneous caliza dolomia with side pull holds and slight bulges. It is rather abrasive and riddled with pockets. The rock dries pretty fast, most of the routes are even climbable on a wet weather!

Openers : A. Dunand, D. Tatoud, D. Souvy, D. Mouchené –2001/2002

#### ACCESS:

From Champagny Village (start of the gondola), take the path leading to the "Combes" for 2km until a junction (EDF post of "La Cartanaz") From here you have 2 options:

- Follow the road climbing up the embankment to the Ravière hamlet and reach the crag (15min walking from the EDF post, perfect for warming-up).
- Keep going towards "Les Combes d'en Haut" then "La Duy".
   At the yellow sign board "La Ravière", go down at the left for
   5min. The crag is at the left before the hamlet.

#### **GEARS & ADVICES:**

14 boulted routes. The length varies between 12 and 15m, with sealed bolts—anchor with biners—rope of 40m, 6 draws.

The name of each route is written at the bottom.

Altitude cliff, subject to frost and thaw alternating cycles. Always check the holds as well as the bolt resin. Wearing an helmet is strongly advised.

#### **OBSERVATIONS:**

Nearby, on the path between "Les Combes d'en Haut" and "La Duy", you can find a perfect area suited for a family picnic and petanque games among others...

# CLIMBING CLIFF THE FOOTHILLS OF GRANDE MARIANNE



#### ACCESS:

Access via Champagny-le-Haut, starting from the hamlet of Le Bois.

High mountain rock climbing (major routes) in the area of the Plan des Gouilles refuge (2347m) > 2h30 walk from the Le Bois car park.

This site is located at the pass of La Grande Marianne, 25 minutes from the refuge in the direction of the Col des Galinettes and the Gd Bec refuge.

This site currently offers 3 routes. A 4th route is under construction.

#### **EQUIPMENT:**

The first pitches of these routes can be used as windmills. Descend by abseiling or on foot.

#### SABRINA ROUTE TD

Lenght 92 m 5 short pitches in 6a A few pitches in 6b A good but very steep route Abseiling possible: 50m rope Descent on foot: 30m rope is sufficient (recommended)

**Gear**: 10/12 quickdraws - 50m rope if abseiling - 30m rope if descending on foot, i.e. a return to the foot of the route in 10 minutes.

#### **BALOU ROUTE D+**

Lenght 50 m

2 pitches of 5b with 1 pitch of 5c (L2). Continuous difficulties

L1: ideal for moulinette

Abseiling possible: 50 m rope Descent on foot (recommended) with a short abseil of 15m - 30m rope

**Gear**: 10/12 quickdraws Back to the foot of the route in 5 minutes

#### **RENARDEAU ROUTE D+**

Lenght 50 m

2 pitches in 5b with 2 steps in 5c. L2 shared with BALOU route

L1: ideal for moulinette

Abseiling down the route possible: 50 m rope

Descent on foot (recommended) with a short abseil of 15 m - rope of 30m

Gear: 10/12 quickdraws





#### INFORMATION

The distinctive feature of these rock climbing sites is the fact that they are altitude cliffs, and so subject to frost and thaw phenomenon. Wearing an helmet is more than advised

Keep the place tidy.

At Le Torchet, bins are available on site.

#### Be careful

the activity you're about to do unfolds on mountains grounds with the risks that it entails. It needs a great knowledge of the approaches to be used.
